BRIEFING ON THE OUTCOMES OF THE LIMA - PARIS ACTION AGENDA

The briefing will provide delegates with an overview of the outcomes of the Lima - Paris Action Agenda (LPAA) culminating in the COP 21 Action Day held on 5 December. The briefing by the LPAA partners (Peru, France, UNFCCC Secretariat and the Executive Office of the Secretary General of the United Nations) will include information on commitments made by non-Party Stakeholders as well as the 70 climate action coalitions that have been mobilized across the 12 action areas, which include cities and subnationals, energy access & efficiency, renewable energy, transport, innovation, agriculture, forests, private finance, resilience, buildings, business, short-lived climate pollutants. The briefing provides a foundation for the event on the global climate action agenda to be held on Friday 20 May at which the Climate Champions will set out the road map for climate action in the lead up to COP 22.

ACCELERATING THE GLOBAL CLIMATE ACTION AGENDA
